On her appointment, Karen said: "I am excited about joining with everyone and getting to know you all. It has been a long journey with God's gentle but persistent calling.

"My Nan first introduced me to Jesus when I was a young girl. But it was after a conversation with Jehovah witnesses at my door one evening, and disagreeing on the Trinity that I knew I

Ignite is a bit like café style church mixed with messy church, although a different style of worship it is still very God centred. Ignite is about building relationships with marginalized communities, walking with people where they are and bringing the God news of the kingdom in an easy and accessible way. Another shriek from my co-pilot! I wasn't sitting far enough back in the seat. For a moment the trajectory was looking poor, we needed to glide over the pine and cedar forest - not hit the floor. I envisaged us tangled and dangling in the branches like a failed parachute landing. Brief tension as we skimmed over the tree tops. I could almost brush the emerald canopy with my socks!

Once clear of the mountain peak we rose further, vaulting into vast vistas of endless cerulean, broken only by the slimmest wisps of cirrus hair. I was flying and completely without a care.

As my eyes engaged with the contours below my mind accepted that the shapes were land tableau; an immense distance away - an aerodyne view. How could I be here so safe and serene buoyed up with only nylon fabric, lines and straps and the realisation of a dream? Buckled into this triumph of lightweight propulsion, I felt fearless, transfixed and perfectly at peace and beheld such astounding views from my simple hammock seat.

On that afternoon I soared like an eagle, flying along the avian roads. Gliding, spinning, pirouetting, dancing in the thermal flows, peering down on our tiny civilisation below. Unfettered and free.

Nature Notes

Since my last note, nature has sprung some very pleasant surprises as I meandered along Mill Lane. The most prominent were a cluster of six orchids along the edge of

the field. This is the first time I have seen these and it is almost certain that the seed has laid dormant for many years.

Earlier I had noticed a cluster of enormous bracket fungi sprouting from the stump of an ash tree that had fallen some few years ago; once again one has to admire the workings of nature. In time the stump will be no more as the fungus will eventually assist in the rotting of the stump assisted by the various beetle grubs that will live and pupate there.



Although we see the fruits of fungus in its various forms such as mushrooms and toadstools these could be compared to an iceberg in that most of this "plant" is underground. The fruits are there to spread the spores but they are connected to a threadlike matter that spreads through the soil. This is called the mycelium. If we take an oak tree as an example underground mycelium combines with the roots of the tree and in return for breaking down the minerals for the trees well-being the fungus is allowed to feed off the tree roots; such a relationship is known as symbiosis.

This is an example of a beneficial fungus however there are some fungi that we don't want in our backyard. One of these is Honey fungus (armillaria mellea) which can and does attack what seem to be perfectly healthy trees; it is often referred to as the bootlace fungus because the mycelium appears behind the bark in the form of a black thread.

If fungi didn't exist we would be inundated with piles of debris as they are responsible for the rotting of leaf matter amongst all sorts of organic matter. "Walker"

Extract from Chairman's Report – Annual Parish Meeting 20th July 2021 Highways - Speeding issues continue to be a concern in the Village. Our efforts to date have included encouraging the Police to be active in speed monitoring. The new footpath along Faversham Road underwent a design assessment in Autumn 2020. The security of funding was undermined due to increased costs from the design assessment. However, progress is in place in securing additional funds from Ashford Borough Council for the footpath to be installed.

The Parish Council have received offers of help to operate speed watch from parishioners and I am pleased to announce the Speed watch is now up and running. Badlesmere, Leaveland & Sheldwich Parish Council have kindly loaned their speed watch equipment to Challock Parish Council. The Parish Council would like to thank parishioners volunteering to carry out the speed watch. It is hope more volunteers will come forward. Molash & Chilham have recently formed a speed watch team, so the A252 will benefit from the extra input in recording motorist behaviour.

A collective alliance with Badlesmere, Leaveland & Sheldwich and Boughton Aluph Parish Councils was formed to improve road safety along the A251. A couple of meetings with KCC Highways & KCC Ward Councillor Andrew Bowls took place prior to March 2020, unfortunately due to the pandemic further meetings are on hold. However, the Parish Council have produced a draft Highways Improvement Plan for the village. The plan involves carrying out speed monitoring via the police and speed watch volunteers which in turn will provide statistics. Road safety assessments and proposed safety improvement measures i.e., gated entrances, lower speed limits. KCC Highways have some funds available, but the Parish Councils would also need to contribute and look towards other funding avenues. Parish Council's will work collectively where possible and savings can be made on some of the works/surveys. Copies of the Highway Improvement Plan for Challock is available on request and

the Parish Council would welcome feedback on the proposed plan.

A252 Safer Roads Fund Scheme funded by Road Safety Foundation and proposed safety improvements along A252 between the villages of Chilham & Charing with the works now completed. A post installation & road safety assessment is currently in progress. This includes the



reported visibility concerns at the roundabout. The Parish Council reported to KCC Highways of our assessment of the installation measures and requested consideration for the installation of speed cameras through residential areas. KCC have responded that they are considering speed cameras.

William Oure Trust - The Parish Council would like to thank parishioners who looked out for our vulnerable parishioners, especially as we were in lockdown and many parishioners were having to have Christmas alone, by providing a Christmas dinner. The trustees of the William Oure trust will be looking to provide a winter package to our vulnerable parishioners and a coordinating Christmas lunch service.

Planning – a public consultation meeting for High Tree Lodge for 26 dwellings took place during 2020. Overall consensus is to object to the application. The Parish Council will challenge the application at ABC planning committee due later this year. The application currently has been granted an extension to allow for the developers to address drainage concerns. The Parish Council has ring-fenced £2,000 towards consultative representation at the appeal meeting.

To avoid any further deterioration in the water quality of the Stodmarsh European designated site pending further investigations as to the cause. This has direct consequences for some new development proposals within parts of Ashford Borough which includes Challock. Throughout the past year we have been busy receiving planning applications for extensions, additional buildings etc. Clockhouse Green phase 2 development has been sold on to a new developer. The S106 developer contributions applies and the table of obligations list contribution towards the provision of a skate park, an extension to the existing play area, new equipment, and site furniture at the playing field/recreation ground in Blind Lane, contribution towards a Multi-Use Games Area at the playing field/recreation ground in Blind Lane and contribution towards a hard surfaced access and additional seating at The Lees.

The Lees - A donated tree by the Challock & Molash Gardening Society for Mr Mitchell has been planted on the Lees and a memorial seat for Mrs Mitchell is due to be placed on the Lees, adjacent to The Lilybuds in the coming months. It is with regret that recent anti-social behaviour activities in the village, the tree has been vandalized. The tree will be replanted in the Autumn. The 15 tree saplings donated by Ashford Borough Council were planted in various areas of the Lees during 2020. Those planted on the Lees have grown except for one which has now been replaced by one from the wooded area of Lees.

Over the past 5 years there has been unauthorized encampments mainly on the top section of the Lees. This has cost the parish council funds in excess of £10000. The top section of the Lees perimeter has been secured by wooden bollards and a number of retractable bollards to allow access onto the Lees for grass cutting and events. The Parish Council are disappointed that we have had to secure our wonderful open space but could not continue with allocating parish funds for unauthorized encampments along with increasing risk factor of higher costs. When the Lees is fully secured parish funds can be spent on much needed other projects.



As custodians of the Lees, the Parish Council carries out an annual inspection of the Lees in the Autumn.

Earlier this year the Rewilding Project Group approached the Parish Council for some areas of the Lees not to be cut and to see what wildflowers might grow. The Parish Council had previously approved for a wildflower area on the Lees for the school to get involved with. The Rewilding Group, Councillor Aitken, and the school eco group planted seeds in the area after the grounds man had scarified and rotovated the area. The Parish Council will be reviewing the rewilding areas in the Autumn and would welcome feedback from parishioners.

Speed watch - Speed watch sessions have now commenced. To date we have recorded a 187 people speeding and an advisory letter is sent by the police. To make a real difference we need to be running more sessions in the various approved sites around the village. The sessions run about an hour, so if you are able to spare an hour once a week/fortnight, please consider joining us. If you are interested in joining Challock Speedwatch Scheme please email <u>csw@kent.police.uk</u>. Commencing with on-line training followed by face-to-face training.

Godmersham Church welcomes pilgrims following The St Sigfrid's Way - which is an epic pilgrimage route spanning just over 760 miles.

Named after an 11th Century pilgrim, it begins in Sigfrid's home city of York and arches down the spine of England through a spectrum of urban and rural landscapes, rich with the history and cultural diversity of the British Isles.

South of Oxford it turns east along the Thames, runs through London and Canterbury, and ends by the sea in Ramsgate. It then continues in Sweden from Göteborg to Växjö, where Sigfrid built a church and exemplified the way of nonviolence and peace.

While rooted in the Christian tradition, St Sigfrid's Way is open to all who feel the call to make pilgrimage. The only faith you need is in your feet for walking the path, and in your heart for embracing the unknown.

On 6th July, Godmersham Church welcomed three intrepid pilgrims who had walked over 500 miles. They began their pilgrimage in York and followed St. Sigfrid's Way through England with Ramsgate the final destination of their pilgrimage in the UK. Along the route the pilgrims had been joined by others for different stages of the pilgrimage. The group shared a supper with Gail, Doug, Caroline and Cathy before settling own for the night in the church, resting their weary feet before their next stage to Canterbury via Chilham.



All in the Month of August

250 years ago, 15th August 1771, that Sir Walter Scott, Scottish historical novelist, poet, and playwright was born. His best-known works include Ivanhoe and Rob Roy.

250 years ago, on 7th August 1771, that the first recorded ascent of Ben Nevis was made. Scottish botanist James Robertson ascended Ben Nevis, the highest mountain in the British Isles. Nowadays, 100,000 people per year make the ascent.

125 years ago, on 17th August 1896, that the death of the first person killed in a motor accident in the UK took place. Bridget Driscoll was crossing a road in the grounds of London's Crystal Palace when she was hit by a car giving demonstration rides. By way of contrast, nowadays, an average of 5 people a day die on UK roads.

90 years ago, on 19th August 1931, that the Yangtze River and Huai River floods peaked in China. It was one of the worst natural disasters of the 20th century; up to four million people died, and the floods lasted from July to November.

80 years ago, on 15th August 1941, that the German spy Josef Jakobs became the last person to be executed at the Tower of London. (Parachuted into WWII Britain)

75 years ago, on 16th August 1946, that the Great Calcutta Killings took place in Kolkata India. Muslim and Hindu mobs rioted across the city following the Muslim League's demand for the creation of Pakistan. More than 4,000 people were killed and 100,000 left homeless. The riot sparked further religious violence in other provinces, leading to the Partition of India in August 1947.

60 years ago, on 13th August 1961, that East Germany sealed off the border between East and West Berlin to prevent the exodus of refugees to the West. Initially barbed wire fences were erected; construction of the Berlin Wall began on 15th August. The border reopened in 1989.

50 years ago, on 9th August 1971, that Northern Ireland introduced internment, the power to detain suspected terrorists indefinitely without trial.

40 years ago, on 25th August 1981, that the US space probe Voyager 2 reached Saturn and sent back images and data. It travelled to Uranus (1986) and Neptune (1989) before reaching interstellar space in 2018. 43 years after launching, it is more than 11.8 billion miles from earth, but remains operational.

30 years ago, on 6th August 1991, that the first website (info.cern.ch) went live. The web's inventor, Tim Berners Lee, also posted a description of the World Wide Web project on the alt.hypertext newsgroup, and provided a link to download the first web browser, which could only run on NeXT workstations.

30 years ago, from 19th to 21st August 1991, that there was an attempted coup in the Soviet Union when hard-line members of the Communist Party tried to seize control from President Mikhail Gorbachev. The coup failed after 3 days & eventually led to the collapse of communism and the disintegration of the Soviet Union. On 29th August the Supreme Soviet suspended all Communist Party activities.

25 years ago, on 23rd August 1996, that Saudi Arabian-born terrorist Osama bin Laden issued a fatwa entitled A Declaration of War Against the Americans Occupying the Land of the Two Holy Places. Few people knew who he was at the time, and it received little attention.

73 Years of the NHS. Then and Now.

The NHS celebrated its 73rd birthday on Monday 5th July, just as Kent and Medway recorded administering 2 million doses of the Covid vaccine since the first batches became available just over six months ago. Perhaps, at this point, it is worth reflecting on the momentous changes in health, life expectancy and the evolving Health Service that have taken place since 5th July 1948, when antibiotics had only recently become generally available.

The establishment of the NHS was the boldest of the ventures made during the period of reconstruction after the Second World War. The Act which brought it into being was passed in an atmosphere of controversy and there has been continuing criticism of its working since. However, whatever its shortcomings, the establishment of NHS was a powerful recognition by the community that the maintenance of health and treatment of sickness are public responsibilities and services should be free to all. 73 years on, these remain the core underpinning principles of the service.

At the time, the thinking was that if you could improve the health of the nation by eliminating disease, then there would be less need for doctors rather than more. In fact, we quickly learned that the opposite is true. Helping people to live longer means that health needs are infinite, but we only have finite human and other resources to tackle the increasingly complex range of health and related issues that confront us. The pandemic has brought this fact home, with painful impacts on all aspects of delivery of health and welfare services and, in particular, the need to provide online socially distanced rather than the face-to-face interactions that were largely the norm before. Both patients and medical staff have found the abrupt transition extremely difficult and frustrating. The relationship between doctor and patient, described in 1953 as 'the true basis of the family doctor's life and often his chief reward' has increasingly been under threat over the last 18 months.

The pressing need now is for doctors and patients to renegotiate that relationship by seeking constructive ways forward that avoid leaving many patients feeling frustrated and anxious and doctors feeling overwhelmed by the backlog of treatments and a demanding programme of vaccine roll out which looks likely to continue for the foreseeable future.

We are all in this together.

Climate Change is Happening

Pat Crawford provides the Rural Focus Press Group Comment & Advice Column

In his June statement, UN Secretary-General António Guterres said "Humanity is waging a relentless, self-destructive war on nature. Biodiversity is declining, greenhouse gas concentrations are rising, and our pollution can be found from the remotest islands to the highest peaks". He added "We must make peace with nature".

Leading climatologists have expressed disappointment with the recent G7 Summit's Climate Plan which has been described as 'light and fluffy' and 'comprising vague promises without deadlines or deliverables'.

Despite the pandemic and numerous lockdown measures, global carbon dioxide emissions have reached record highs. During May CO² concentration measurements taken at Mauna Loa observatory atmospheric monitoring station, reached a new record: 419.13 parts per million in May this year, up from 417.31 ppm in May 2020.

Meanwhile despite target global target carbon reduction targets being missed, the developed world's economies bounced back from the pandemic bossing world wealth to a new high: half a quadrillion dollars.

Northumbrian Water is leading a trial involving scientists from Warwick and Cranfield universities that involves taking the ammonia in sewage and using it to create hydrogen with the intention of it being used to fuel buses, lorries, vans - even aircraft. Every ton of sewage two grams of 'green hydrogen' which could be sold which, in turn, would reduce costs of sewage treatment.

The World Meteorological Organization, a specialized agency of the United Nations, reported that the latest CO^2 emissions are increasing acidification of the seas and, linked to this, a drop in the amount of CO^2 that can be absorbed. Ocean acidification has already weakened coral reefs which shield coastlines; in the last 30 years, between 25 and 50 per cent of the world's live coral have been lost. 'Healthy oceans', responsible for absorbing 23 per cent of CO^2 emissions, are fundamentally important.

Business makes another big step forward: Southern Co-op, which provides services across the south of England, has had its ambitious emissions reduction targets approved by the Science Based Targets initiative, a collaboration between the UN Global Compact, World Resources Institute and the World Wide Fund for Nature.


Remembering Sir Walter Scott

Sir Walter Scott, the Scottish historical novelist, poet and playwright, was born 250 years ago, on 15th August 1771. His best-known works include Ivanhoe & Rob Roy.

Often considered to be both the inventor and the greatest writer of historical novels, he was inspired by a stay with his grandparents in the Scottish borders during his early childhood, while he recovered from polio. From them he heard stories and ballads about the area and became fascinated by the history and culture of Scotland, where all his early work was set - often published anonymously.

On a visit to the Lake District in 1797 he met Charlotte Carpenter, who he married after a whirlwind romance, much to the disapproval of his parents, who suspected she was a French Catholic. But she was a British citizen who had been christened in the Church of England: the couple were happy until her death in 1826.

Scott was widely admired for both novels and poetry and was once offered the post of Poet Laureate, which he declined. He was plaqued during later life by financial problems, largely brought about by taking on the debts of friends and colleagues, but also by expenses incurred from his Abbotsford estate, near Galashiels.



What do you consider to be 'beautiful countryside'?

According to Natural England, thorny scrubs and floodplains should be seen as more beautiful than manicured fields.

Tony Juniper, chair of Natural England, which is the government's adviser for the natural environment, has said a 'cultural revolution' is necessary to help people appreciate the beauty of a messy countryside.

He strongly supports the increasing popularity of 'rewilding' projects which have become a popular way for land managers to give nature a chance. He believes that rewilding can help to heal degraded landscapes & provide better habitat for wildlife.

Tony Juniper has said that the "orderliness" of much of our British countryside, with neat stone walls, sheep-grazed fields and villages has often created "ecological deserts" for wildlife, who starve. "To ensure our future security, it will be necessary for us to let nature take back some control."

A post-Brexit plan to reward farmers and other land managers for improving water quality and helping plants and wildlife is expected to replace the EU's Common Agricultural Policy.
