Christmas Greetings



"...The time came for Mary's baby to be born; and she gave birth to her first child, a son. She wrapped him in a blanket and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them at the inn."

This Christmas season will certainly be different from those that we have experienced in the past, but we can, still, each celebrate the birth of the Christ child in our own way.

Just over 2,000 years ago, God came down to be with us here on earth, in the form of the baby Jesus, to experience exactly what it was like to be one of us. And He didn't seem to have a very promising start in life either. Born, to a young unmarried Mum, in a stable. Then, Mum, Joseph and the baby become refugees as they flee for their lives.

I don't know about you, but it sounds a very familiar story – not just the nativity story from the Bible, but the story of so many families who continue to flee for their lives from Syria and other war torn countries around the world. 2,000 years later, but still the same story. So rather than living a life of luxury and wealth, God chose to be one of those who lived on the outside – on the margins.

And how do we respond to those who have been forced to leave everything behind them – just as Mary and Joseph and their baby Jesus had to do? If Mary and Joseph arrived here, how would we greet them? Would we welcome them into our homes, give them food, drink, clothing and shelter – or would we just shut the door in their faces and say "Sorry, no room for the likes of you here!"

So if you can, please consider giving to one of the many Christmas charities that support those who are on their own, have nowhere to live or won't have a Christmas lunch without our help and support. You may just be able to give someone the Christmas that they will always remember. Jesus, both God and man, born to be our Saviour said: "What you do for the least of these, you do for me."

One of the hymns we sing each Christmas is "O come, O come Emmanuel". Emmanuel means "God is with us" and that is my prayer for each and every one of us – and not just for Christmas, but for life.

I wish everyone a very Happy Christmas and Peaceful New Year.



Nature Notes

There are many majestic trees lining Mill Lane, all are oak and ash. However, even though I have passed this way for several years I hadn't noticed that there is one exception to the norm. One of the tallest caught my eye last week when I stood to admire it in that I noticed the leaves were narrower than normal and so on reaching home I consulted my book which confirmed that this was a Turkey Oak, with the Latin name Quercus Cerris.

The Turkey Oak is native to S.E Europe and Asia Minor and was introduced to UK as an ornamental tree in the 18th Century; its acorns are held in cups with hairy like surrounds. The presence of our Turkey Oak in Mill Lane poses an interesting question. Was it planted as an ornamental tree or did it get mixed up with other oaks being planted at the same time; who planted this and the other trees.

We have three more oaks commonly found in this country. There is our native oak Quercus Robur or its alternative name Quercus Pedunculata characterised by the acorns being borne on long stalks. The other native is Quercus Sessiliflora, the sessile oak which has no stalk to carry the acorn and cup. The third is the

evergreen oak Quercus Ilix commonly known as the Holm Oak native to native to the Mediterranean but common here.

If I return to one of my earlier notes I made reference to the work of Carl Linnaeus who devised an international means of classifying living things by giving them first a generic or group name followed by second which is the specific name.



The Latin names illustrate this Quercus (oak) followed by robur (robust); pendunculata (long flower stalks); sessile (flowers attached to its base); Ilix (having leaves like a holly, Ilix being the generic name of the holly.

Give a 'hog a home

Hedgehogs make hibernation nests in winter called 'hibernacula' – these can be under hedgerows, fallen logs or in areas of scrub like bramble. They are durable, insulated and help maintain humidity to prevent dehydration for the sleeping 'hog. They also make simpler day time nests for resting, sleeping, breeding and rearing young in over summer.

our garden can provide lots of great nesting spots for 'hogs - under your shed, in compost heaps, shrubs, under leaf piles or under logs or spare building materials. But, sometimes hedgehogs need a helping hand. You can buy pre-built hedgehog houses online or in stores, or have a go at making your own - homemade houses tend to be more popular with our prickly visitors

The simple DIY Hedgehog House

Take a spare plastic storage box, planter or milk crate (make sure it has holes) and flip it upside down. Make an entrance that's 13cm x 13cm and provide some bedding like dry leaves or pet straw. You can cover the rest of the box with some plastic sheeting and then cover with leaves/soil/grass cuttings


The tricky DIY Hedgehog House

Hedgehogs seem to love home-made houses made from untreated wood (ideally durable UK softwood species like larch, Douglas fir and red cedar). Don't nail the roof down (so that you can clean inside) and avoid using paint. Tunnels help stop predators or cats getting into the house and can be made of wood or bricks.

Houses are best placed in sheltered locations, along boundaries, in back gardens and within 5m of the house. The presence of pets or predators doesn't appear to put off a local hedgehog from moving in.

Place a twig over the entrance. If it's moved you know someone is visiting your 'hog house.

Any straw or dry leaves left outside will likely be taken in and used for bedding.

Community shops engage large numbers of the community and stimulate social activity and community cohesion: they typically involve 177 members, 7 directors, 30 volunteers, and 4 staff. All in the Month of December

400 years ago, on 21st December 1620 that the first landing party from the British ship Mayflower arrived at what would become Plymouth Colony (now Plymouth Massachusetts). They began building houses there two days later.

300 years ago, on 31st December 1720 that Charles Edward Stuart, commonly known as 'Bonnie Prince Charlie' was born. Stuart claimant to the British throne and leader of the unsuccessful Jacobite rebellion of 1745-46. Grandson of King James II of England and Ireland (also known as James VII of Scotland).

250 years ago, on 16th December 1770 that Ludwig van Beethoven, was born.

90 years ago, on 2nd December 1930 that in his second State of the Union address, US President Herbert Hoover announced a huge public works programme to stimulate the economy and create jobs during the Great Depression.

80 years ago, on 29th December 1940 that Germany dropped thousands of incendiary bombs on London, causing the worst fire damage since the Great Fire of London in 1666. About 200 people were killed.

75 years ago, 27th December 1945 the World Bank, the International Monetary Fund, and the International Bank for Reconstruction & Development were founded.

70 years ago, on 14th December 1950 that the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (also known as the UN Refugee Agency) was established.

65 years ago, on 1st December 1955 that African American civil rights activist Rosa Parks refused to give up her bus seat to a white man in Montgomery, Alabama, violating the city's racial segregation laws. This incident led to the birth of the modern American civil rights movement.

60 years ago, on 9th December 1960 that the first episode of the television soap opera Coronation Street was broadcast in the UK.

40 years ago, on 8th December 1980 that John Lennon, rock musician and peace activist and a member of the Beatles, was shot dead, aged 40, outside his New York City apartment by Mark Chapman, a deranged fan.

30 years ago, on 1st December 1990 that British and French construction workers on the Channel Tunnel broke through the last wall of rock separating the two halves, and Britain and France were linked for the first time in thousands of years.

25 years ago, 13th December 1995 Brixton riot took place in south London. 100's of youths rioted on the streets following the death of a black man in police custody.

20 years ago, on 13th December 2000 George W Bush claimed the US presidency, 36 days after the election, following a legal battle over disputed votes in Florida.

15 years ago, on 19th December 2005 that the Civil Partnership Act came into effect in the UK. The first civil partnership under the act was formed in Belfast, that same day. The first in England and Wales were on 21st December.

10 years ago, from 18th December 2010 to December 2012 the Arab Spring took place in North Africa & the Middle East. Telling the Bees

There was a time when almost every rural British family who kept bees followed a strange tradition.

Whenever there was a death in the family, someone had to go out to the hives and tell the bees of the terrible loss that had befallen the family.

Failing to do so often resulted in further losses such as the bees leaving the hive, or not producing enough honey or even dying.

Traditionally, the bees were kept abreast of not only deaths but all important family matters including births, marriages, and long absence due to journeys. If the bees were not told, all sorts of calamities were thought to happen. This peculiar custom is known as "telling the bees".

The practice of telling the bees may have its origins in Celtic mythology that held that bees were the link between our world and the spirit world. So if you had any message that you wished to pass to someone who was dead, all you had to do was tell the bees and they would pass along the message.

The typical way to tell the bees was for the head of the household, or "goodwife of the house" to go out to the hives, knock gently to get the attention of the bees, and then softly murmur in a doleful tune the solemn news.

Little rhymes developed over the centuries specific to a particular region. In Nottinghamshire, the wife of the dead was heard singing quietly in front of the hive, "The master's dead, but don't you go; Your mistress will be a good mistress to you." In Germany, a similar couplet was heard,

"Little bee, our lord is dead; Leave me not in my distress".

But the relationship between bees and humans goes beyond superstition. It's a fact, that bees help humans survive. 70 of the top 100 crop species that feed 90% of the

human population rely on bees for pollination.

Without them, these plants would cease to exist and with it all animals that eat those plants. This can have a cascading effect that would ripple catastrophically up the food chain.

Losing a beehive is much worse than losing a supply of honey. The consequences are life threatening.

The act of telling the bees emphasizes this deep connection humans share with the insect.



Census 2021 will provide a snapshot of modern society

Households across Folkestone and Hythe District will soon be asked to take part in Census 2021. The census is a once-in-a-decade survey that gives us the most accurate estimate of all the people and households in England and Wales. It has been carried out every decade since 1801, with the exception of 1941.

It will be the first run predominantly online, with households receiving a letter with a unique access code, allowing them to complete the questionnaire online.

"A successful census will ensure everyone from local government to charities can put services and funding in the places where they are most needed. This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, schools and new transport routes. That's why it is so important everyone takes part and we have made it easier for people to do so online on any device, with help and paper questionnaires for those that need them." Iain Bell, deputy national statistician at the Office for National Statistics, said.

Census day will be on March 21, but households across the country will receive letters with online codes allowing them to take part from early March. The census will include questions about your sex, age, work, health, education, household size and ethnicity. And, for the first time, there will be a question asking people whether they have served in the armed forces, as well as voluntary questions for those aged 16 and over on sexual orientation and gender identity. Results will be available within 12 months, although personal records will be locked away for 100 years, kept safe for future generations.
