Challock Wild Flower Project

The local project group have recently been reviewing Kent's Plan Bee programme and have been working in conjunction with Kent Wildlife Trust and our local Parish Council to consider the next phase of actions for this ongoing project.

The importance of supporting our pollinators at this time, when wild habitat is under immense pressure, cannot be overstressed and with your support we would like to ensure that Challock becomes a contributor to the conservation of pollinators and their habitats in the heart of our local village.

The open spaces and land available provide us with an opportunity to safeguard our pollinators which are essential to our local farming and food resources. Use of this resource can also prevent further decline of the environment which provides pollination of every third mouthful of our food which is so dependent on a wide variety of insects.

These insects are central to Kent's Fruit Farms as well as Kent's natural beauty providing a better place to live, enjoy and visit. Losing our pollinators would be a major ecological and economic disaster!

The project group will shortly be arranging a leaflet drop around the village to explain our plans and to canvass for your help thus ensuring that our local parish council are aware of the strength of feeling that is held by so many local nature lovers. Last year we received some fantastic support from many of you when we put out an appeal to grow wild flower plugs for planting on the Lees, an example of local support in action! The local school also got involved in seeding an area of the Lees to provide a colourful and worthwhile display which will continue to improve in future seasons.

The KCC Plan Bee was unanimously approved and agreed in May 2018 and we all can help to ensure that our local councillors are aware of the need to make a significant contribution to the effort required.

Have you made New Year resolutions to either keep fit or get fit? If so, have you included your spiritual welfare as well as your physical welfare in your New Year resolutions? If not, you could be missing out!

That post-festive period when we start out full of good intentions rarely lasts. For example, it is estimated that around 100,000 people join gyms every January and it's not hard to think why after turkey, Christmas pud and chocolate have done their worst! It also testifies to the emphasis we place on physical health and fitness in our culture. However, according to the Fitness Industry Association most people quit or stop going to the gym after 24 weeks & most rarely make it to the end of January or February

Gyms are communities dedicated to helping people acquire physical health and fitness. You go to a gym to learn a set of exercises that will help you develop a more attractive, healthier, fitter body. There is of course, a cost involved. It costs money, time & effort. Yet people do it. Statistically 800,000 people a year join gyms. Of course, many don't actually go (apparently Britons waste £37m per year on unused gym memberships and slimming classes!) but we still believe the narrative.

Gyms offer a clear picture of what you can change into and provide the means to get there. Gyms offer the prospect of change, of personal transformation, of the opportunity to do what before you could not do, of life enhancement. And people will pay the price: financial, physical and mental to get such transformation.

However, fitness is not just about physical or mental fitness. We also need to consider our spiritual fitness and our Churches are the equivalent of gyms for the health and fitness of our spiritual welfare. The early church often used athletic metaphors for the spiritual life. 1 Tim 4 speaks about "training yourself in godliness", 1 Cor 9: 24-27 compares Christians to athletes who "go into strict training" & early Christian monks were often referred to as spiritual gymnasts, with their feats of fasting and endurance. In other words, the early churches saw themselves like gyms do today – communities focused on enabling personal transformation, only this time spiritual, rather than physical. Just as a physically fit person can do things a physically unfit person can't, the same is true spiritually: spiritually fit people can forgive when they are wronged, give when they are relatively poor, keep their temper when provoked and keep their promises to their wives or husbands even when sorely tempted not to do so.

In Jesus Christ, we have seen an image of the perfect soul. This role model may not be featured in OK magazine or appear on the catwalk, but he does walk with us each and every day. You don't have to be a Christian to realise that life tends to work better if you and those around you strive towards acquiring the qualities we see in Christ – those of patience, kindness, generosity, love, humility and forgiveness. Just imagine what life would be like if we practiced these "spiritual exercises" every day and if these became the habitual reactions to adversity and life in general? So if you haven' visited your local parish church in a while why don't you give us a go and refresh your spiritual welfare? You could get an amazing spiritual workout without even breaking into a sweat!





Pancake Recipe

Ingredients

120gPlain white flour2Eggs (free range)300mlMilk (whole or semi)

Sugar or caster sugar 1 Lemon freshly squeezed (Or a Jif lemon)



Method

Step 1

Mix the flour, eggs and milk to form a batter. Ideally leave to stand for 30 minutes (Batter mix should be slightly thinner than for batter puddings)

Step 2

Put some cooking oil in a Pyrex jug. Heat a 18 cm / 7 inch frying pan add a small amount of oil. Swish it around then pour back any excess there should not be any running oil in the pan as that could be dangerous during the pancake tossing.

Step 3

When the oil is very hot put two table spoons of batter (or we use a ladle) and swirl the pan so that the batter covers the pan thinly. Cook for about 1 minute each side.

Step 4

Serve immediately sprinkled with lemon and sugar



How to Toss a Pancake

- 1. Cook the pancake on one side it's cooked when it comes away from the pan when you give it a little shake
- 2. Remove from the heat
- 3. Tip the pancake to the edge of the pan furthest away from you, and three, two, one... flip Toss confidently if you are timid or hesitant the pancake is liable to end up a crumpled mess.
- 4. Cook it on the other side and flip again if you like

Chinese New Year - 1st Feb 2022

The New Year according to the Chinese Calendar. 2022 welcomes the Year of the Tiger. Chinese New Year is celebrated all around the world.

What is the Chinese zodiac?

Each year on the Chinese calendar is linked to one of 12 zodiac animals, each with their own specific characteristics.

The twelve animals are:

Rat	Ox	Tiger	Rabbit	Dragon	Snake

The animals are assigned in cycles of twelve years, so 2020 was the Year of the Rat, and so was 2008, 1996, and so on.

What are the origins of the Chinese zodiac?

The cycle is based on an old folk tale called the Great Race, in which all twelve animals take part in a race to reach the Jade Emperor. The order they completed the race is the order in which the years are named.

The Rat won out against the bigger animals by catching a ride on the back of the ox and then jumping off its back at the last minute.

This means the Ox, who had been due to win the race, had to settle for second place and the others fill in the places behind, with the Pig coming last.

2022 is the Year of the Tiger, known to be king of all beasts in China. The Year of the Tiger previously fell in 2010, 1986, 1974, 1962, and so on.

Next year, it will be the Year of the Rabbit, then the Dragon.

What do the animals mean?

In Chinese astrology, the animal signs assigned by year represent how others perceive you or how you present yourself. That is, depending on the animal

assigned to the year in which you were born, your personality traits are believed to be different.

But it is a common misconception that the animals assigned by year are the only signs - in fact, there are also animal signs assigned by month (called "inner animals"), by day (called "true animals") and hours (called "secret animals").

One should also be wary of being quick to celebrate when it is one of "your" years - according to Chinese astrology, the year you are born is supposed to be the unluckiest for you, so people born in previous Tiger years may face bad luck in 2022.



Here is what each of the signs mean:

Rat - People who were born in the Year of the Rat are said to be quick-witted, resourceful, and smart but lack courage. Due to their work ethic, however, they are thought to be wealthy & prosperous. Lucky colours: blue, gold, green.

Ox - An Ox is said to have an honest personality. People born in the Year of the Ox are known for being diligent, dependable, strong, and determined, though find it difficult to communicate. Lucky colours: white, yellow, green.

Tiger - People born in the Year of the Tiger are brave, competitive,

unpredictable, and confident. Confident, charming and well liked they sometimes



possess a stubborn personality too. Lucky colours: blue, grey, orange.

Rabbit - Rabbits tend to be of a more gentle nature. Quiet, elegant, kind, and patient, rabbits have many positive characteristics but can also be known to be superficial. Lucky colours: pink, red, purple, blue.

Dragon - Hot-headed with a sharp tongue, people born in the Year of the Dragon are also said to be confident and intelligent, and natural leaders. Lucky colours: gold, silver, grey.

Snake - Intelligent and wise, goal-oriented and hate to fail, people born in the Year of the Snake are supposed to be the most intuitive and a symbol of wisdom. Lucky colours: black, red, yellow.

Horse - People born in the Year of the Horse are said to be active, animated and energetic. A lover of mass gatherings - sports events, live concerts, parties - horses crave the spotlight. Lucky colours: green, yellow.

Goat - A thoughtful animal, people born in the Year of the Goat are generally thought of as being gentle, mild-mannered, shy, sympathetic and incredibly kind-hearted. Creative and tough under the surface. Lucky colours: brown, red, purple.

Monkey - Monkeys are sharp, smart but also have a mischievous side to their personality. Thought to be masters of practical jokes, due to their playful nature, they are also fast learners and prefer urban life to a rural one. Lucky colours: white, blue, gold.

Rooster - Always active, amusing, and popular within a crowd, roosters are talkative, outspoken, frank, honest, and loyal. Roosters expect to be listened to and their achievement acknowledged. Lucky colours: gold, brown, yellow.

Dog - Loyalty and honesty are two personality traits of those people born in the Year of the Dog. Kind, cautious, and prudent though communication is where they fall down, leading to others thinking they have a stubborn personality. Lucky colours: green, red, purple.

Pig - Pigs are diligent, compassionate, and generous. One of their strengths is their ability to concentrate and forge ahead to achieve their goals, though they are easily fooled. Lucky colours: yellow, grey, brown, gold.

Nature Notes

As I write these notes in mid-January the sun is shining. I have just returned from my walk, and made aware of how things are stirring in the woods. The hazel catkins are hanging from the trees, cow parsley leaves are providing a flash of green and the spikes of cuckoo pint are emerging from the ground. In the garden there are also spikes of snowdrops, daffodils, and tulips.

What a lovely time of the year with more abundance to look forward to.

Even the birds are more active. We will have to wait a few more weeks for the volume to increase, meantime the thrush is busy establishing his territory but it is the Robin that is most vociferous.

Robins are unlike most birds in that both the male and female sing and they use this to full effect in establishing and maintaining their territory even fighting to the death. They are favourites of most people because of their supposed tameness although this is more of a basic instinct in following first of all animals who disturb the ground exposing grubs which the robins soon grab and then us as we cultivate our allotments. The sexes are indistinguishable.

Robins start nest building in late March. The nest is usually in a bank although commonly in discarded kitchen pots and consists principally of moss and dead leaves. On one occasion a gardener hung up his coat in a tool shed at 0915 and when he took it down at 1300 there was an almost complete robin's nest in one of the pockets.

The eggs which are white, speckled with small reddishbrown spots are usually five in number, there are normally two clutches and the incubation period is thirteen to fourteen days.

The young leave the nest after a fortnight, at this stage they have a speckled breast which changes to red later when they moult.

All this to look forward to as the spring develops. We are so lucky to have this bounty and must never take it for granted. "Walker"



The first recorded association of Valentine Day with romantic love (1382) is from Geoffrey Chaucer. He wrote,


'For this was Saint Valentine's Day, when every bird cometh there to choose his mate.'



The **2022 Winter Olympics** are just a few days away! See below for the answers to all of your frequently asked questions surrounding the Beijing Winter Games.

When are the 2022 Winter Olympics?

The 2022 Winter Olympics are set to take place on Friday, February 4 through Sunday, February 20, just six months after the Tokyo Games. However, the competition begins with curling on Wednesday, February 2, two days before the Opening Ceremony.

Where are the 2022 Winter Olympics taking place?

The 2022 Winter Olympics will be held in China across three zones: Beijing, Yanqing, and Zhangjiakou. The ice sports will be held in central Beijing, China's capital, as well as four snow events (snowboard big air and freestyle skiing big air, men's and women's). The Opening and Closing Ceremonies will also take place in Beijing. Yanqing, a mountainous suburb of China's capital located approximately 75 km (46.6 miles) northwest of Beijing's city center, will host Alpine skiing and sliding events (bobsleigh, skeleton, and luge) and will also be the home of the Olympic Athletes' village. Zhangjiakou, located approximately 180 kilometers northwest of Beijing (111.8 miles) will host the majority of the ski and snowboarding events including freestyle, cross-country, ski jumping, Nordic combined, and biathlon.

What sports are being contested?

There will be a total of 109 medal events across the following 15 sports:

Alpine Skiing Bobsled Curling Freestyle Skiing Luge Short Track Ski Jumping Speed Skating Biathlon Cross-Country Skiing Figure Skating Hockey Nordic Combined Skeleton Snowboarding

Additionally, the 2022 Winter Olympics will feature seven new events: Women's Monobob, Men's and Women's Big Air (Freestyle Skiing), Mixed Team Snowboard Cross, Mixed Team Aerials, Mixed Team Short Track Relay, and Mixed Team Ski Jumping.

Update On Access To Medical And Vaccine Services

The last two years have seen significant changes in the ways we are able to access medical services and vaccine clinics. It used to be the case that a call to the surgery was the gateway to nearly all medical help, but the pandemic has changed many things and identifying the various websites and services can sometimes be confusing.

E-consult or a phone call to the surgery remain the first route for referrals but, if the surgery is closed, NHS 111 is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week (ring 111 or go online at **<u>111.nhs.uk</u>**). The 111 service can direct you to support on a wide range of conditions and can book appointments at the right service. If you need emergency services, NHS 111 can book an arrival time for you at A and E, which may mean a shorter waiting time.

The Urgent Treatment Centre at the William Harvey Hospital is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and you can walk in at any time. It can provide treatment for non-life-threatening situations such as sprains and strains, suspected broken limbs, cuts and grazes, bites and stings, high temperature in children and adults, minor head injuries, minor scalds and burns, ear and throat infections, skin infections and rashes, vomiting and diarrhoea, abdominal pain and emergency contraception.

There are other sources of help, too. Community pharmacies have taken on a muchenhanced role and are now part of the GP triaging system. You may be referred to the pharmacy directly by the surgery.

Health is not one-dimensional and can be affected by a variety of emotional, social and economic factors. The establishment of NHS Social Prescribers services in every GP practice is an acknowledgement of this. Social Providers can provide links to a wide range of community based support services relating to health and wellbeing, mental health and services for children and young people. You may be referred by your GP or you can make a direct referral, either for yourself or somebody else, via the IMAGO website at <u>www.imago.community</u>.

A number of people have not yet taken the opportunity to have a Covid booster and there are plenty of appointments available at both pre-booked and walk-in clinics. You can book your vaccination appointment by calling 119 or accessing the national booking system via <u>www.nhs.uk/coronavirus-vaccination</u>.

Climate Change is Happening

Pat Crawford provides the Rural Focus Press Group Comment & Advice Column

Ability to concentrate on an issue - to focus - is good but not when it becomes tunnel vision and destroys our ability to apply the lateral thinking that takes account of related concerns: Climate Change increasingly falls into this category. Ability to take account of the bigger picture is also inhibited by the fact that the policies of democratic governments around the world are fundamentally based on short-termism.

Two other factors play important parts in attitude to Climate Change. One relates to nimbyism: although accepting that Climate Change is a vast problem affecting the entire world, millions and millions of people believe their personal contributions towards limiting carbon emissions are so small, so trivial, that they are not worth the effort. The second factor relates to the assumptions made in relation to much-used words and phrases – one such being 'Climate Change'. Recognition and familiarity with a phrase can result in switch down and turn off, the assumption being 'I've heard it all before' whereas the issues relating to Climate Change evolve, develop and expand. Climate Change is not standing still; unfortunately, most of the changes are in the wrong direction.

Scientists began investigating 'weird weather' during the early 19th century

when natural greenhouse gas effects were first identified. Research progressed but, in retrospect, far too slowly. Climatologists around the world released wide-ranging documents but for a long time they were interpreted as 'the very worst-case scenario'. It wasn't until 1972, at what was termed the First Earth Summit, that the UN adopted a Declaration laying out principles for preserving and enhancing the human environment; governments were warned of activities that might lead to climate change aka global warming. Towards the end of the twentieth century threats to the ozone layer were becoming big news and a notable step forward



United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change

was made when 158 countries signed up to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).

Countries around the world have made substantial pledges in regard to the reduction of carbon dioxide, methane, nitrous oxide and other greenhouse gases and there is no doubt intentions are very good. Converting 'intentions' into 'actions' is fraught with difficulties but it has to happen if our beautiful planet is going to be saved. We're all in this together – every contribution, however small, will help.







Mick's Computer Chat

Computer Games and Other Software

This month I thought I would cast my eye over computer games not how to play them but a few tips on saving some money and installing them.

Steam

This well known game platform can be very useful for installing games. One thing that is useful is if you want to play some of the older game titles. Games can come up in bargain buckets in shops and you can pick up some classic titles for a couple of quid in DVD format. Seems good except they can give you issues when you try to install them on modern computers running Windows 10 or 11.



Bring on Steam. Just login to your steam account and search for your nice shiny classic game. Once you find it you can install it for free using the key that came with your DVD. Steam will install the latest version of your game already configured to run on your copy of Windows. And it adds it to your Steam game library. So you start the Steam client and go to your Library of games. At the bottom left there is a big plus sign and "ADD A GAME". Click on it and pick "*Activate a Product on Steam*". It will then ask you for the Game security activation key. This is usually on a sticker inside the DVD case or on the back of the booklet inside the DVD case. It is in the format of XXX-XXX-XXZ etc. You just type in the key and Steam will recognise the game the key is from. It will then download and install the game for you. Obviously one other benefit of this is you can install DVD games even if your PC or Laptop does not have a working DVD player! So you can install a £2 game with Steam that if you bought it through Steam may cost you £20.

Steam Family Sharing

While on the subject of Steam, there is also a useful option for your family called Steam Family Sharing that allows up to five steam accounts on up to 10 computers to share games. No need to buy each child their own copy of a game. The only downside is that just one person at a time can play the game. This is perfect for games that are popular but a bit older or that one person has finished.


See a family member's installed game that you want to play? Send them a request to authorize you. Once authorized, their library of Steam games becomes available for you to access, download and play.


