Dear Friends in Christ

Why do we find it so hard to forgive and forget?

On the 17th April 1986 a peace treaty was finally signed between the Isles of Scilly and the Kingdom of the Netherlands. For the first time in 335 years the Scillonians could sleep safety in their beds, for as the Ambassador remarked; "It must have been awful to know we could have attacked at any moment!"

The 335 Year War (as it is now known) was a bloodless conflict between the Netherlands and the tiny Isles of Scilly which began as far back as 1651 during the English Civil War. Regardless of the specifics, three months later in June 1651 Cromwell's forces under the command of Admiral Robert Black forced the Royalist fleet to surrender and the Isles of Scilly reverted to Parliamentarian control. The Dutch fleet subsequently sailed home, albeit forgetting to declare peace on the poor little Isles of Scilly! It only came to light once again in 1985 when a local historian called Roy Duncan wrote to the Dutch Embassy in London to see if there was any evidence to support the seemingly absurd claim of a 335 year war. To everyone's surprise, the embassy uncovered a series of documents which suggested that the Netherlands and the Islands were, indeed, still at war!

A silly example of a ridiculous situation, yet how often do we fall out with each other – whether it is with our neighbour, friends or family member? If the conflict continues how long will it be before we can't even remember what the disagreement was all about in the first place? Some disagreements continue through the generations, yet to what purpose, when those who originally disagreed are long gone?

We look at the news on the TV or the headlines in the newspaper and shake our heads in disbelief at the mayhem of war and conflict, wondering why peace is so difficult to find, and yet we too often have unresolved issues ourselves.

Someone once asked Jesus: 'Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?' Jesus said to him: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

So if we truly believe the words: "Evil and hatred are put to flight and sin is washed away, lost innocence regained" what are we actually going to do about it? Each time we say the Lord's Prayer we pray "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us." If the Lord, who died for our sins, is willing to forgive us, who are we not to forgive others?

So if you have unresolved issues with someone, why not pick up the phone or go and see them – after all, what have you got to lose? And it could just be the beginning of a wonderful friendship.

My Father's Garden

(by Lynwen Paddy, March 2021)

My father's garden was a wonderful place, each year such vibrant life and colour would embrace. A space so creatively planned and designed, a heavenly patchwork quilt from a mastermind.

Down the cold stone steps into subterranean depths, dark and dank the cool air froze my breath.

The cobwebs brushed my hands, face and arms as spiders scuttled into pitch black safety much alarmed.

The old air raid shelter was a relic from another era; it brought those stories of living through the war years a little nearer. Whilst apples wrapped and stored in trays filled its basement, a grassy knoll rose above with tiny flowers fragrant.

A squarish lawn with a paved centre bed, each quarter thoughtfully planted to create a dazzling summer spread. Encircled by multiple pots of blooming pink and scarlet geraniums, the effect was so beautifully Mediterranean. Along three sides deciduous shrubs, espalier apple and evergreens abounded, their fruits and blooms, berries and flaming hues always astounded. We played badminton and cricket within this pretty picture, enjoyed tasty meals and drank homemade lemonade from a pitcher.

Grassy paths and stony tracks weaved like a thread through the landscape pulling together compartments into a vaulted fan shape.

A dainty carpet of green bedecked with cherry tree blossom, flanked by scree beds and rockery miniatures skimming along the bottom.

Opening out to the vegetable plot, the source of regular harvest, where rows of succulent greens, beans and pulses were planted by the hands of an artist. Nestling close by was a crop of sweet aromas - bright ruby red and juicy; I don't recall the variety of those strawberries but they could have been ozark beauties.

The soft fruit garden so very well stocked was planted out on a wing, an abundance of berries, shades of red, black and green was an annual offering. The greenhouse well camouflaged amidst fruity bushes and canes, place of nurture and ring culture for tomatoes, seeds and bulb strains. The last segment a shady grove where apple and pears trees flourished; Cox's and Bramley, Conference and Comice from ground well cared for and nourished. From tall sinewy stems and clinging tendrils the scent of sweet peas wafted over; cut and gathered their pastel petals would fill our house with floral odour.

My father's garden was a wonderful place and try as I might, impossible to replace. It brought such joy, such warmth, such fun and games and will forever run deep in my veins.

Nature Notes

I have just returned from my walk with the dogs. The record rainfall may have been a nuisance to us all but there is no doubt as to its promotion of lush greenery everywhere. The hawthorns are particularly splendid with their may blossom just emerging.

Beneath the hedge the greater stitchwort is matching the may blossom, their spindly stalks gaining a foothold on the perennial grasses. At one time stitchworts were eaten as part of a salad and are relatives of chickweed; they are also the host plant for several moths and butterflies.

As I walked by the wood the sun was offering dappled light through the tree canopy illuminating the bluebells and red campion which this year are flowering together, a thrilling site.



Yesterday we visited a group of gardens opening under the National Garden Scheme. This is something we do on a regular basis and it gives us much pleasure. The contrast between the different houses was amazing, however one theme shone out and that was the efforts most of the householders were making to garden in a more wildlife friendly way Most had areas of grass left to grow to help the pollinators some had log piles for the bugs, others proudly announced that they were not using chemicals or peat based composts.

One garden in particular had erected what I thought were bat boxes on the gables but when I enquired I was informed that they were swift boxes which answered a slight mystery in so far as moments before I had commented to my wife that I had heard swift's screaming but could not see them; it transpired that a recording was being transmitted to attract them to the newly erected boxes.

We should be grateful to all those who support the NGS through their garden openings as millions of pounds are raised through this scheme for charity, particularly in the fight against cancer. The cream teas and home made cakes are an added bonus!

All in the Month of June

175 years ago, on 28th June 1846 that Belgian musical instrument maker Adolphe Sax patented the saxophone.

125 years ago, on 4th June 1896 that Henry Ford completed his first automobile, the Ford Quadricycle, and gave it a test run around Detroit Michigan. It was a simple frame with an engine, two gears, a tiller for steering and four bicycle wheels. It had a top speed of 20mph. Its success led him to establish the Ford Motor Company.

100 years ago on 10th June 1921 that Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, was born on a dining room table in Corfu. He was the husband of Queen Elizabeth II.

90 years ago, on 13th June 1931 that Jesse Boot, 1st Baron Trent, British pharmacist and philanthropist, died. He had turned his father's Boots Company into a national chain of chemists.

80 years ago, from 22nd June to 5th December 1941 that Operation Barbarossa took place. It was the German invasion of the Soviet Union, the largest military operation in history. In the end, it was a Soviet victory, for the German invaders were repelled when they reached Moscow, and then driven out by a counter-attack.

75 years ago, on 26th June 1946 that Field Marshall Bernard Montgomery became Chief of the Imperial General Staff (head of the British army).

65 years ago, on 13th June 1956 that the first European Cup final (soccer) was held, in Paris. Real Madrid (Spain) beat Stade de Reims (France) 4-3. The European Cup is now known as the UEFA Champions League.

60 years ago, on 6th June 1961 that Carl Jung, Swiss psychiatrist and psychologist, died. He was the founder of analytical psychology.

50 years ago, 16th June 1971 that John Reith (Lord Reith), 1st Baron Reith, Scottish business executive & politician, died. He was Manager & Director General of the BBC in its formative years. He also formed BOAC (now British Airways).

40 years ago, on 5th June 1981 that the first report of AIDS took place. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in the USA reported that five homosexual men in Los Angeles were suffering from a rare form of pneumonia found in patients with weakened immune systems. These were later recognised as the first official AIDS cases.

40 years ago, on 22nd June 1981 that American tennis player John McEnroe earned the press nickname 'Superbrat' when he threw a tantrum during his first-round match against Tom Gullikson at Wimbledon. He hurled abuse at the umpire, swore at the referee, and popularised the phrase 'you cannot be serious' when he disputed a line call. Nevertheless, he went on to win the men's singles championship that year.

25 years ago, on 4th June 1996 that the Second Severn Crossing was officially opened. The bridge spans the River Severn and links England and Wales via the M4 motorway.

20 years ago, on 22nd June 2001 that two British schoolboys who murdered two-year-old James Bulger in Liverpool in 1993 were released from secret custody after 8 years. They were given new identities and moved to secret locations.

Direct Access To Social Prescribing Services

Social Prescribing Services may be something of an enigma to many people, but over the next four years NHS England plans to have them attached to every surgery, bringing greater recognition that health is not just physical, but emotional & social too

Social Prescribers are already attached to Wye Surgery. They provide Health and Wellbeing coaching, as well as Adult Mental Health and Children and Young People's Mental Health services. What has changed is that people can now refer themselves directly, rather than having to wait to be referred by a GP.

The aim is that the patients who need more than a clinical intervention to enable them to live healthier more fulfilling lives are enabled to become active participants in their own care.

No one knows better what will help you than you yourself. Social Prescribers will focus on your particular situation and help to unpick what might be stopping you enjoying optimum health, before linking you up with appropriate organisations and community activities.

If, for example, you are anxious, depressed or demotivated, face to face sessions with a sympathetic social prescriber can help you identify issues and connect you with sources of support. It might be links with a particular community activity or addressing aspects of wider social need like debt, poor housing, unemployment, loneliness or onerous caring responsibilities.

There are a range of specialist types of support for children and young people who are struggling with poor mental health, with the aim that early intervention can prevent escalation to specialist psychiatric services. The Health and Wellbeing coaches can also provide practical advice and personalised care plans, for instance exercise regimes that take account of personal circumstances like mobility difficulties.

How can you make a self referral? Social Prescribers are employed by an organisation called IMAGO, commissioned and funded by the Ashford Stour Primary Care Network of which Wye Surgery is a part. You can refer yourself or you could refer a relative or friend with their consent. The weblink to the IMAGO Social Prescribing page may be found at www.imago.community. You will find a full description of the services on offer and, below this, the "start" button for the self referral form.

Climate Change is Happening

Pat Crawford provides the Rural Focus Press Group Comment & Advice Column

The United Nations continues to pour out documents urging member countries to do more to reduce carbon emissions. Most bulletins reinforce the information contained in earlier reports. A recent online discussion chaired by Executive Director Inger Andersen focused on the "significant and path breaking" information contained in the UN agency's report Making Peace With Nature (www.unep.org/resources/making-peace-nature) that breaks down the science but also shines a light on 'the kind of gearshifts' needed to move forward. Ms. Andersen warned that, unless improvements are made, "the planet is set to lose about a million species". That is roughly 1/8 of the species currently existing in the world.

Research by McKinsey reveals that more than 4,500 companies around the world self-reported (ie, weren't forced by law) their Greenhouse Gas emissions. The research went on to reveal that, of those 4,500 companies, about 40% have committed to specific targets. The same research indicates that at least 50% of the targets are on track. Good news - but in global terms, a mere drop in the ocean?

One of the most positive advances relates to the fact that customers – consumers – want to know far more about the origins of the goods they purchase in relation to corporate behaviour and Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) issues.

People Power has the ability to make differences that really matter and young people, especially, wield huge influence. Swedish teenage climate activist Greta Thunberg is an outstanding example but, although lauded as a global phenomenon, she also suffers extreme hatred; fortunately she is able to rise above it. At the other end of the age spectrum, Sir David Attenborough is recognised as a national treasure in this country and the wildlife and conservation films for which he provides the narration are watched by millions around the world.

Another young activist, Denis Hayes, helped to launch Earth Day in the United States in 1970. Environmental campaigning was at the heart of the endeavour but the world didn't know what we know now! This year Earth Day fell on 22nd April and interest and response reached new levels. US President Joe Biden invited 40 world leaders to a virtual, two-day summit that commenced on Earth Day. Boris Johnson took the opportunity to warn the President and other leaders that they must slash emissions or 'be remembered as the people who failed the planet'.

The Allington Integrated Waste Management Facility, operational since 2008, has now accepted 500,000 deliveries of waste - equivalent to 6m tonnes. The waste is incinerated so preventing an estimated 93% being consigned to landfill. The electricity generated is fed into the National Grid. Located on a former quarry site, owners FCC Environment have pledged to plant 500,000 wildflower seeds across the site. ('You cannot please all the people all the time': inevitably there are some objectors to the location of the site.)

U.N. Deputy Secretary-General Amina Mohammed said that "Forests are at the core of the solutions that can help us make peace with nature". Forests provide vital functions and are guardians of fresh water sources and biodiversity protection. Meanwhile, according to a report by Global Forest Watch, tropical forest losses hit their third-highest level in almost two decades in 2020 - 4.2 million hectares of

primary forest (intact areas of old-growth trees) equal to the size of the Netherlands.
