Service of dedication to Polly & Doug Parsons

On 26th September, just one day after the second anniversary of Doug's death, St. Mary's, Chilham celebrated Doug and Polly's life and

dedicated a new memorial in the church to their memory as "Faithful servants of this parish".

To be granted permission to introduce a new memorial into a church is a very rare honour today and the recipients must have demonstrated exceptional service both for the church and community.



Following Polly's death in 2005 Doug continued to support and enable mission and ministry not only within the Chilham Parish, which includes Old Wives Lees, where Doug and Polly lived, but also within the wider King's Wood Benefice which includes Challock along with Molash, Crundale and Godmersham.

A person with a very deep faith, Doug wished to continue to support and enable the church to reach out in mission and ministry and Doug has made this possible by leaving a substantial legacy to the church.

This is indeed an amazing and generous gift that will enable ministry to continue in the King's Wood Benefice for the foreseeable future; a gift from God which we have a responsibility to manage with care and accountability.

There are a number of ideas that the PCC is currently considering that will make our church more accessible and practical so we can serve our community better and bring people together, inside and outside the church building. For example, one idea includes updating our very tired kitchen in the church so that we can continue to welcome pilgrims and visitors of all nationalities by offering refreshments. We also hope to be able to invite the local school children to the church so that they can develop their cooking and baking skills.

Doug was indeed very community minded & helped to support many organisations, so if you have any ideas about how the church can become involved in outreach to the community, please do let me know and we will consider all proposals.

As a parish, and as part of the King's Wood Benefice, we cannot just draw down from this gift to pay for our everyday expenses. We will still continue to organise events, not only to engage with the community but also to raise funds for our ongoing mission and ministry.

I look forward to hearing from you about your ideas about future initiatives.



Enjoy fireworks responsibly – Stay Safe this Autumn

Follow these top tips:

- Always supervise children around fireworks and never give sparklers to a child under 5.
- If you organise your own fireworks, only buy them from a reputable retailer and prepare in advance during daylight.
- Follow instructions carefully on the use of each type of firework and use eye protection and gloves.
- Have a bucket of water nearby.

Remember the Fireworks Code:

- Fireworks should not be sold to anyone under the age of 18.
- Only buy fireworks marked as BS 7114.
- . Keep fireworks in a closed box.
- Light them at arm's length using a taper.
- Stand well back.
- Never go back to a lit firework.
- Never put fireworks in your pocket.
- · Never throw fireworks.
- Keep pets indoors.
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix and may lead to injury.

Know the law:

- It's illegal to let fireworks off between 11pm and 7am except on Bonfire Night (midnight), Diwali, New Year, and Chinese New Year (1am).
- It's illegal for anyone under the age of 18 to possess fireworks in a public place.

100 Years of Red Poppies

Amid the mud, blood and carnage of trench warfare in World War 1, tens of thousands of bright red poppies grew, marking the graves of the fallen. This led John McCrae, a Canadian army physician who had lost a colleague, to write "In Flanders Fields".

In Flanders fields, the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row That mark our place, and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly.

This image inspired the adoption of a red poppy as the symbol of all soldiers who had died in conflict. Exactly 100 years ago, on the 11th November 1921, poppies of remembrance were sold for the first time in British and Commonwealth countries. Hostilities had actually ceased three years earlier at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month.

This year, on the 14th November, which is the nearest Sunday, a two-minutes silence will be kept at war memorials throughout the country, and at the national ceremony at the Cenotaph in London's Whitehall. The Queen will pay tribute alongside Members of the Cabinet, Opposition Party leaders, former Prime Ministers, the Mayor of London and many others. Representatives of the Armed Forces, Fishing Fleets and Merchant Air and Navy will be there, as well as High Commissioners of Commonwealth countries. All will wear a red poppy.

Around 30 million poppies are sold each year in the UK by the Royal British Legion. All the proceeds are used to provide serving and ex-service personnel with financial support, advice, employment, mobility, housing & mental health facilities.

Today we are more aware than ever that battles are fought mainly by young people, and many of those who survive bear scars for life. The act of 'remembering' will not only look back to mark their sacrifice, but also yearn to learn lessons for the future.

Reflecting on the poem, 'In Flanders Fields', the American professor Moina Michael, wrote:

And now the Torch and Poppy Red We wear in honour of our dead. Fear not that ye have died for naught; We'll teach the lesson that ye wrought In Flanders Fields.

Doctor Livingstone, I presume?

It was 150 years ago, on 10th November 1871, that Welsh iournalist and explorer Henry Morton Stanley located the missing missionary Dr David Livingstone near Lake Tanganyika, in present-day Tanzania. He may or may not have greeted him with the words: "Doctor Livingstone, I presume?"

Stanley's real name was John Rowlands. He was born in Denbigh to an unmarried 18-year-old who abandoned him. He ended up in a workhouse until he was 15, then went to America, where he changed his name and became an American citizen. When he found Livingstone, he was working for the New York Herald.

Known for his strength of will, Stanley also had an African name – Bula Matari – Breaker of Rocks. Much of his life was spent in Central Africa, and his reputation was mixed: he was said by some to be violent toward Africans, but by others to have treated them well. His feats as an explorer were impressive: he played a big part in locating the true source of both the Nile and the Congo, and he helped open up the Congo on behalf of King Leopold of Belgium.

Though not overtly religious, he felt he was engaged in a "sacred task". He was re-naturalised a British subject in 1892, following his marriage.



Our affection for Premium Bonds

Some 65 years ago, on 5th November 1956, Premium Bonds went on sale in the UK. They were designed to encourage people to save, and they offered cash prizes instead of interest.

The idea was to persuade people to save again following the Second World War, and on the first day alone, £5 million worth of Bonds were bought (equivalent to about £120 million today). The name of the machine that generated the winning numbers – the Electronic Random Number Indicator Equipment, shortened inevitably to Ernie – became common in everyday conversation.

There is no guarantee that you will ever win, which in many people's eyes defines Premium Bonds as gambling, though the counter to that argument is that you can never lose your stake. You do, however, lose whatever interest you would have accrued if you had invested your money elsewhere.

The current odds against each £1 Bond winning a prize are 34,500 to 1. This has been described as "a gamble with very poor odds". Nevertheless Premium Bonds are said to be held by more than 22 million people, or about 1 in 3 of the UK population.

All in the Month of November

200 years ago, 11th Nov 1821 that Fyodor Dostoevsky, the Russian novelist, short story writer and journalist was born. Best known for his novel Crime & Punishment.

150 years ago, on 10th Nov 1871 that Welsh journalist and explorer Henry Morton Stanley located the missing missionary and explorer Dr David Livingstone near Lake Tanganyika in present-day Tanzania. He might or might not have greeted him with the words: "Doctor Livingstone, I presume?"

125 years ago, on 16th Nov 1896 that Oswald Mosley, British fascist politician, was born. Imprisoned for three years in 1940 for founding the British Union of Fascists.

100 years ago, on 11th Nov 1921 that Remembrance poppies were sold for the first time in British and Commonwealth countries to commemorate military personnel who died in war. In the UK they are sold by the Royal British Legion to raise funds for current and former members of the British Armed Forces. Around 30 million poppies are sold each year.

80 years ago 13th Nov 1941 British aircraft carrier HMS Ark Royal torpedoed by a German submarine in the Mediterranean Sea near Gibraltar. It sank the following day.

30 years ago 5th Nov 1991 Robert Maxwell Czech-born British newspaper publisher, media proprietor & politician, was found dead at sea off Tenerife. Following his death, he was found to have fraudulently used the Mirror Group's pension fund.

WYE SURGERY PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP Continuity Of Care - Where Has It Gone And Why?

Patient surveys over many years have consistently shown that patients value continuity of care more highly than almost every other aspect of their care, yet this seems increasingly difficult to achieve. Nationally, most patients no longer have a named GP who is primarily responsible for their care and are not encouraged to try to build a relationship with a single practice member. Patients have to quickly come to trust an unfamiliar face or unseen digital entity and may not feel confident or secure enough to impart important intimate information or to share underlying health concerns that they may have hardly dared to acknowledge to themselves.

There is compelling evidence from research and experience that continuity of care leads to greater patient and staff satisfaction, reduced costs and better health outcomes, particularly for older patients with complex health needs. Yet it feels as if continuity has been all but abandoned as an aspiration. GP shortages, spiraling demand resulting from the pandemic and the rapid escalation in the use of online systems have made continuity of care vanishingly rare. This pragmatic response to the current situation does not mean that continuity no longer matters.

Continuity of care allows the doctor to accumulate knowledge about the patient that saves time and expedites the management of the case. We have to be realistic in acknowledging that what many see as the 'good old days' of general practice are not going to return, but what can be done about addressing some of the problems which can arise as a result of the fragmentation of service delivery? Can good practice be redefined to include continuity of care? At the moment it requires a 'savvy' patient to communicate well remotely, especially when access is difficult.

Current primary care systems try to achieve management continuity by sharing information about symptoms, treatments and coordination of the care the patient needs, but very often fail to recognize the value of relationship continuity with a single clinician as part of the therapeutic process. This is difficult to achieve during the pandemic crisis, but should be part of longer term NHS planning. Case management systems may communicate with each other about the patient, but may fail to communicate well with the patient. The person in the middle it is not always clear who, if anybody, is responsible for joining up the dots.

Climate Change is Happening

UN Secretary-General António Guterres describes the global phase out of leaded fuel as a "milestone for multilateralism". It is interesting to note that the campaign to eliminate leaded fuel lasted more than twenty years.

Steel production is responsible for very considerable carbon emissions partly due to burning fossil fuels (some estimates suggest the industry emits about 9% of the total carbon dioxide emissions worldwide.) The Smithsonian Institute has revealed that a few companies are experimenting with a manufacturing process that is powered by renewables. The results are said to be 'promising' and plans are for 'greener steel' to ramp up production in the next there to five years.

The World Meteorological Organisation (WMO) and the UN Office for Disaster Risk have stated that, over the last fifty years, Extreme Weather Events have caused a surge in natural disasters.

Research undertaken by Waitrose indicates a lot of their 10p plastic bags were only being used once and they have been withdrawn. The supermarket claims that the replacement 50p bags are twice as durable, fully recyclable and made from 100% recycled content. Although the new bags are available in store, Waitrose say they would prefer customers to use their own bags as 'this is the best way we can collectively work together to do the right thing and help save our planet'.





Over the last couple of months I have found myself frequently running up and down to London. My wife Sue had been diagnosed with a heart problem and needed a bypass operation. This is why last months Forester was late. As a consequence of this I have had some recent experience with the different websites designed to help with travel. Some very good some not so good.


The Good

So my task was to get from here to Kings College
Hospital in London. So first we drove, not good London traffic made the last section
of the journey a nightmare. But parking was easy thanks to a website and app we
found called Just Park (www.justpark.com). It's a very clever idea. You rent off
road parking on local people's drives. So we pre-booked and rented a space on a
drive a couple of minutes walk from the Hospital. It is a very clever system. You
just tell the website where you want to go and what times you want to park. The
website will then show you all the drives in the area you can book. The prices differ
and you can choose which you want to use. You can drill down and see a picture of
the house and the drive along with address and directions.

To park in London cost us about £7 a day with this system and that was until 9pm (visiting finishes at 8pm). I can thoroughly recommend this system it is cheap, simple and works well. Plus it is more secure for your car as it is off road outside someone's house. You can book weeks in advance and it covers most of the country. Once you have made an account login it remembers where you have parked so it is easy to park on the same drive again. The other thing is, it's booked so no worries about finding a space or cost.

Not So Good


Having tried the drive in, we decided a better way would be to drive two thirds of the way to South




Bromley and then take the train to Denmark Hill station which is across the road from the hospital and a 15 minute train ride. A quicker and less stressful journey. Local parking was easy. And I used www.thetrainline.com to help with getting the tickets. This was not so good.


The trainline website is good at helping with train times and general costs but not good at choosing the best or cheapest routes. It invariably chooses the route that it likes not the best, cheapest or quickest. For example Denmark Hill is one stop from Victoria Station. It always wanted to send me into Victoria and out again even though there are direct trains. Going into Victoria and out again is more expensive and takes longer. In the end I had to specifically say "avoiding Victoria". I would always use the website to select my route and check prices but I did not trust it to buy them. I went to the Bromley South station to buy my tickets and found actually there was a cheaper option for the same train. Buy a ticket to Victoria and it was cheaper due to some weekend deal then get off one station early. It turns out there is no need to go into Victoria and out again. So **thetrainline.com** good for checking, No good for planning or buying. This is my personal experience with the two sites


