

Kent Together - HELPLINE Launched by Kent County Council



A 24 hour helpline has been set up to support vulnerable people in Kent who need urgent help, supplies or medication.

The helpline – called **Kent Together** - provides a single, convenient point of contact for anyone in the county who is in urgent need of help during the Coronavirus outbreak. It is a collaboration between KCC, central Government, District, Borough and local councils, the voluntary and community sector, the NHS and other partners to ensure help is at hand for vulnerable people. It is also the place to report your concerns about the welfare of someone else.

Kent County Council Leader Roger Gough said: “In every district and borough throughout Kent and Medway there has been an incredible and heartening response to this pandemic, and we have a huge army of remarkable, public-spirited volunteers who are ready to help each other through these challenging times.

“We now need to make sure that these vital resources are directed to where they are most needed. The new central helpline will link to Community Hubs across the county and ensure that we are effectively working hand in hand with the amazing teams out in the heart of communities in every part of Kent.”

Kent Together is being coordinated by Kent County Council which will feed the information through the network of volunteers, district and borough council teams and local support groups, to ensure people get the support they need, when they need it.

People’s needs will be assessed and staff will liaise with Community Hubs in the districts to prioritise those who need urgent help.

Mr Gough added: “At this unprecedented time, we all need to support each other to cope with the changes to our lifestyles we’ve had to make in order to delay the spread of Covid-19.

“I appreciate those radical changes have brought about difficulties and uncertainty and that we are all having to live our lives very differently.

“I hope with the launch of this service we can help bring some sense of familiarity and comfort back to those who desperately need it.”

www.kent.gov.uk/KentTogether or by calling on **03000 41 92 92**.

It is a 24 hour service.

Longleat

Updated guidance on group contact details

Late on Wednesday, Trading Standards received clarification on [government guidelines](#) about recording details for groups who fail to scan the NHS QR codes. If there is more than one person, you can record the details of the 'lead member' of the group and the number of people in that group (up to 6 people).

The guidance below has been updated to reflect this.

NHS Test and Trace app launched today

You must now display an NHS Test and Trace QR poster for your business. Read the information below so that you can make your customers aware of the rules around QR codes. Watch this video at:

Is it compulsory for your business?

This is the list of businesses and venues that **must** display **NHS QR** code posters at entrances to support contact tracing.

Failure to do so could result in a prosecution or a fixed penalty fine.

Using the NHS Test and Trace Posters

- Remove any other QR Codes you may already display as these will not work with the new app.
- Print enough posters to cover all entrances.
- In busy places put up multiple copies to ensure that a queue does not build up.
- Explain to those customers who do not use the QR Code that their details must be manually added to a contact log.

What to do if customers don't scan the QR code.

If anyone fails to scan the QR code you must take their details. If there is more than one person, you can record the details of the 'lead member' and the number of people in that group (up to 6).

Details must include:

- **The name of the customer.**
- **Contact phone number.** If a phone number is not available, get an email address or postal address
- **Date of visit**
- **Arrival time and, where possible, departure time** (even estimated time will help)
- **Name of the assigned staff member**, if a customer will interact with only one member of staff (for example, a hairdresser). This should also be recorded on the log.

Records must be kept for 21 days

Hospitality venues must refuse entry

to customer that refuse to scan or log their details

PC Aaron Newell Report

I have continued to be out in the area and dealt with various reports and incidents.

There has recently been an increase in rural burglaries, especially to farms and outbuildings. Please take this opportunity to review your security.

There has also been an increase in thefts from motor vehicles, with reports of catalytic convertors and number plates being stolen. Also, theft of a sheep trailer and the theft of 3 wheels from another trailer.

Please be mindful of security and any suspicious activity around vehicles. Report all incidents of theft or suspicious behaviour to Kent Police.

There has recently been a large amount of criminal damage caused to vehicles in Wye. CCTV & other enquiries have been made. Police investigations are ongoing.

Incidents of fraud are also starting to occur again. I will continue to patrol the area as much as possible and deal with any incidents. As always, I would like to remind readers to report any incidents of crime, anti-social behaviour, or nuisance vehicles either on 999/101 or on the Kent Police website. The more reports Kent Police receive the better we can deal with the incidents.

A252 Road Safety Improvements

Following on from the recent road improvement works – please report to the Parish Clerk any damage caused to garden boundary, verges, roads i.e. potholes etc. The Parish Council will be compiling a report on the damage caused to Monkery, Blind & Pested lanes used as a diversion during the road improvement works. KCC will be returning to repair any damage caused to Blind & Pested lane. Clerk will liaise with Charing Parish Council concerning Monkery Lane.

Village Post Office

The village post office is up for sale. In preparation that the Post Office may close the Clerk has made enquiries with Egerton Parish Council regarding their pop-up post office and registering a community asset. Samantha Coe, Change Manager, Post Office Ltd has emailed the Clerk to say they can assist with a pop-up post office and would need premises to operate from i.e. village hall or church hall with Wi-Fi. The Parish Council are liaising with the village post office to try and keep the post office going until a buyer comes along.

The Parish Council would like to thank Andrew for running the village post office for

the last 20 years plus & helping our elderly parishioners with deliveries during the pandemic. Andrew best wishes for your next adventure.



Planning for the Future Consultation

A new government consultation sets three measures that would come into operation under the current planning system, before the more radical overhaul of the planning system set out in the Planning White Paper.

1. Change to the standard methodology for calculating housing needs – this is the overall housing figure that sets the baseline for the 5-year land supply and Housing Delivery Target.
2. Delivering First Homes – introducing a mandatory new affordable housing tenure that will comprise 25% of all development and replace other forms of affordable sale housing.
3. Replace Entry Level Exception Sites with First Homes Exception Sites, except in designated rural areas – these are areas designated under S157 of the 1985 Housing Act. These only covers approx. 30% of parishes of 3K or fewer population).
4. Proposal to raise the threshold that will trigger affordable housing contributions to 40 – 50 dwellings until the economy recovers from Covid-19 with a rural exemption in line with current policy.
5. Extension of the Permission in Principle (PIP) consent regime to major development (sites of more than 10 dwellings) – including greenfield site.

A joint parishes response to consultation has been drafted. See Challock Parish Council's website for draft response to consultation.

Challock Parish Council are concerned that the new consultation will make it even harder for young people to buy affordable homes in the village. The need for more housing and Ashford Borough increased housing targets will put pressure urban areas as well as on villages to build more houses.

'The DR. Will ZOOM You Now'

Understanding the patient experience of remote and virtual consultations

It is estimated that 85% of consultations are now being carried out remotely. A qualitative study carried out by National Voices, Healthwatch England and Traverse between June 22 and July 1 2020 examined the patient experience and produced some 'top tips'.

As the researchers point out the changes in the way care is delivered have happened almost overnight, demonstrating how quickly the NHS responded to the Covid crisis. This means that services have been able to continue to offer care to millions of people whilst also maintaining social distancing. However, if remote consultations are to become the 'new normal', it is vital that people using these services influence how they are delivered.

Drs. and nurses have also had to embrace remote consultation, not by choice, but through necessity. They may be finding it as challenging as you are, but are likely to be keen to learn and adapt its use.

The researchers conclude that for many, remote and virtual consultations are the only options at the moment, so it is important that we continue to look at how it is working for patients, identify which groups who may be struggling and what support is needed to ensure people feel confident to receive healthcare in this way.

The research produced the following 'Top Tips for Patients'

- Ask for a time slot for when your remote consultation will take place.
- Let your health care professional know how you prefer to talk by phone, video or in person.
- Find somewhere quiet and confidential and if this isn't possible or tricky, make this clear when you are making your appointment.
- Start with a phone call if you're not confident with video technology.
- Ask for help if you need it and if possible, do a practice run with a friend.
- Take some time to prepare in advance, consider what you want to say and key questions you would like to ask.
- Ask your health care provider to summarise the next steps at the end of the appointment.
- Remote consultations can be useful for routine appointments or ongoing care with a health care practitioner.
- Not all appointments are suitable for remote consultations. If you would like to see someone in person please say so.

We are all in new territory and it is essential that the patient's voice is clearly heard.



All in the Month of October

550 years ago, on 30th Oct 1470 that Henry VI of England returns to the English throne after Earl of Warwick defeats the Yorkists in battle.

500 years ago, on 21st Oct 1520 that Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan's Spanish expedition to the East Indies discovered the Strait of Magellan at the southern tip of Chile.

210 years ago, on 12th Oct 1810 The very first Oktoberfest is held in Munich, Bavaria, Germany

175 years ago, on 12th Oct 1845 that Elizabeth Fry, died. This prison reformer and philanthropist was depicted on the British £5 note between 2001 and 2016.

100 years ago, on 7th Oct 1920 that Oxford University allowed women to become full members and study for full degrees for the first time, and the first 100 women were admitted.

90 years ago, on 22nd Oct 1930 that the BBC Symphony Orchestra gave its first concert.



CLIMATE CHANGE IS HAPPENING.

Pat Crawford provides the
RURAL FOCUS PRESS GROUP COMMENT AND ADVICE COLUMN

A new study by the University of Leeds and the Danish Meteorological Institute indicates that the rapid rate at which ice sheets in Greenland and Antarctica are melting has resulted in global sea level rising by 1.8cm since the 1990s. This matches the IPCC worst-case climate-warming scenarios.

Dr Tom Slater, lead author of the study and climate researcher at the Centre for Polar Observation and Modelling at the University of Leeds, said "Although we anticipated the ice sheets would lose increasing amounts of ice in response to the warming of the oceans and atmosphere, the rate at which they are melting has accelerated faster than we could have imagined,". Dr Slater continued: "The melting is overtaking the climate models we use to guide us and we are in danger of being unprepared for the risks posed by sea level rise".

Meanwhile countries all around the world continue trying to control the spread of Covid19. The economic impact is vast & at the current time it is difficult to see a way forward but we mustn't allow Climate Change to drop off the worlds agenda.

Aligned to this, The Guardian newspaper has issued a stark warning: 'On November 4, a day after the presidential election, the US will formally withdraw from the Paris agreement on constraining global heat. It's urgent we tell the world what this means"

In September Antonio Guterres, UN Secretary-General, said that without harnessing the energy, tech savvy & optimism of young people, we have no hope of achieving the Sustainable Development Goals or the Paris Agreement on climate change

Our own farmers and growers have been affected by some extreme weather events this year. The NFU (National Farmers' Union) reported that, whilst spring was the sunniest since 1929 when records began – and substantially drier than usual – it followed the wettest February ever recorded. Storms Ciara and Dennis battered many regions of the UK causing flooding so that many farmers were unable to sow seed - an exceptionally dry spring followed and this delayed germination in many areas. As a result wheat yields are expected to be down by as much as 30-35%.

Combine Covid-19 with Climate Change & Brexit and it becomes very apparent we need to support our farmers and growers encouraging them to increase production.



I have my own Facebook page **Neighbourhood Watch Trinity Road Ashford** where there is a lot of information available to you if you use Facebook. I had to add Trinity Road as there is more than one Ashford!



Main Areas To Be Alert And Vigilant With Are:

1. **Your Main property** take care to secure all the doors and windows that have been open during this lovely weather, especially if just "popping out". Please also close windows at the front of properties, if you are enjoying an afternoon in your rear back garden. There have been reports recently of front doors just being "tried" during the night so please ensure the door is secure.
2. Nothing to be left on show in **Parked vehicles** and ensure they are secure. **Vans** with tools and equipment left in them, especially overnight, remain vulnerable. Park with the rear doors tight up against something so the doors cannot be forced.
3. **Sheds, garages and outbuildings** keep secure. Chain items together so removal of an item is extremely difficult. When parking your car in front of your garage park tight to the door so even if the garage door were forced it cannot be lifted open.
4. Care with what is left on show in **gardens** especially children's bikes and toys.
5. **Care with animals in the heat** and especially alert to recent **dog thefts** across the Ashford District. If you drive to the countryside and woodland areas for dog walks be very careful your dog is always in sight and again be very careful what you leave in a parked vehicle. **Remote rural car parks** are targeted by thieves who will wait until you go off walking and they strike.
6. Please be careful with **Scams** which come by **Mobiles, Landlines, Emails, Letters** and indeed now once again by visitors to your doorsteps in the shape of **Bogus callers**. This is about giving yourself time when dealing with these matters. If you are not sure, **Stop and Check and then Check Again**. These crimes above will **especially target the elderly, disabled and vulnerable in the community**. Please support those groups as much as you can.
7. **Horse riding establishments and Dog breeding kennels** have also become a target, the need to be extra vigilant in rural areas cannot be overstated.
8. **Deliveries** to our front doors are also targeted. Delivery drivers can be followed by criminals who will look to scoop up items just left on doorsteps. Care with notes "I'm out all day please put round the back can be read by anyone.
9. If you see activities that suggest **drugs** are in use or being sold please report it.
10. **Anti-social behaviour** blights a community & makes lives a misery, report it.

The Police

Finally, across social media I often read of people saying "It's not worth calling the police as they do nothing!" or ranting and raving about criminal actions but then no further clear message of whether the police have been informed.

Don't make those judgements. Crime in progress or threat of danger call **999**. People acting suspiciously around property or vehicles call the police and use **999 you feel a crime is imminent** or use **101 and/or report on line**

To give the police information, intelligence or to report matters of a non-urgent nature call 101 or use the online reporting system.



It is you they try to convince to let them into the computer. This basically negates all the security software as you allow the malware access. So it is very important you pay close attention to emails that appear important. From "safe" institutions like the government or your internet provider or the NHS or Microsoft. The people who write these malware applications know what you expect those institutions email to look like. Remember the "from" field in an email means nothing to your computer, it can say anything, your computer does not check. You could receive an email from god@heaven.com the hacker can put whatever they like in that field. When you see links in an email like ... "Please email support@btinternet.co.uk" that is not necessarily where the email is going! The underlined text is a link and does not have to match the actual address. If you want to see the actual destination point place your mouse pointer at the link and just hover over it without clicking. The destination the link is pointing at will appear in a little box. In this example supposedly from HMRC you can see that the link "[Claim Now](#)" actually will send you to a different website called thesalthousenw.co.uk and the page [goververify](#). This will be the page the hackers have previously created to look just like the HMRC webpage. On it they will get you to tell them all the information they want while you think you are talking to HMRC.





